Historic maps and LiDAR:

Key maps: look for Pont, Bleau Atlas, Roy Military Survey, Estate maps, County Maps, OS maps. I usually start by looking at Roy (mid 18thC) compared with OS 1st ed 6" (mid 19thC) in the SIDE BY SIDE VIEWER. However, Roy is only for mainland Scotland, not islands.

The Estate maps section on NLS maps includes many for D&G added through the 'Dumfries Archival Mapping Project' (DAMP) – they have a Facebook page.

Scotland's national LiDAR coverage is also available on NLS maps site through the Side-by-Side Viewer.

Outside Scotland? NLS maps have historic OS maps coverage for all of the British Isles.
